
CARES Act / HEERF Emergency Financial Aid Grants

In response to the unprecedented crisis caused by the coronavirus pandemic, the U.S. Congress passed the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (the CARES Act) which established and funded the HEERF (Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund).

_____ HEERF funds received to provide
Emergency Financial Aid Grants to eligible students.

As directed by the U.S. Department of Education, institutions receiving HEERF funds must publicly report the following information 30 days after receipt of funds and every 45 days thereafter:

1. An acknowledgement that the institution signed and returned the certification and agreement form and that the institution has used, or intends to use the funds to provide the mandated amount of at least 50% of the emergency financial aid grants to students.

University of Phoenix acknowledges signing and returning its Certification and Agreement forms for student grants and institutional funding to the U.S. Department of Education. The University received its allocation of the HEERF funds for student grants on May 4, 2020, and the allocation of HEERF funds for the institutional portion on May 8, 2020.

2. The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the HEERF Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

The University of Phoenix has received its full HEERF allocation in the amount of \$6,589,433.

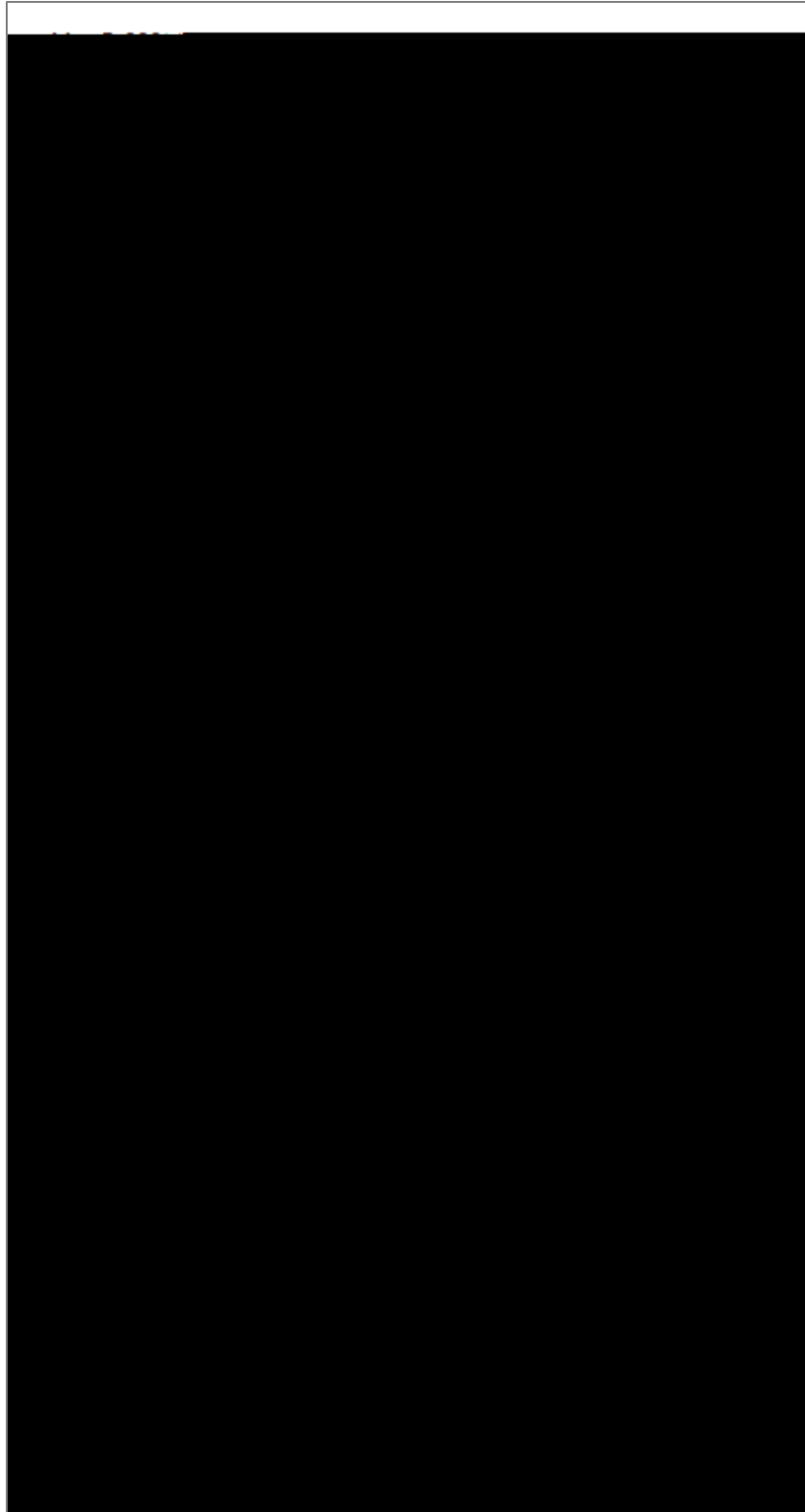
3. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of the date of submission (i.e., as of the 30-day Report and every 45 days thereafter).
