

The Phoenix Doctoral Scholarship March 2024

Summary	<p>All new students who i) apply for and enroll in a University of Phoenix doctoral degree program; (ii) have three year's work experience and (iii) apply for this Phoenix Doctoral Scholarship – March 2024 (“Scholarship”) prior to the deadline and register and post attendance in their first class between March 1st, 2024, and March 31st, 2024 (“Initial Attendance Window”) will receive a scholarship worth up to a maximum of \$3,000 each, distributed over eight courses.</p> <p>NOTE: Students must begin the admissions application prior to completing this scholarship application.</p>
Application Deadline	<p>The Scholarship application will be made available online on February 1st, 2024. Applications must be completed and submitted online at www.phoenix.edu by 11:59pm MST March 31st, 2024 (“Application Deadline”). Applications submitted after the Application Deadline will not be considered. No exceptions.</p>

Eligibility Criteria

1. Applicants currently residing in the United States must meet one of the following requirements: be a legal resident of the United States; have been granted permanent residency; have a valid visa that does not prohibit educational studies; have been granted temporary protected status along with approved Notice of Action issued by Citizen Immigration Services and verified through CIS Form g-845; or have been

	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Applicant must remain in a doctoral program (all coursework attended must be program applicable courses). Awards will only be applied to courses taken as part of their doctoral program, specific to the original program level award.2. Applicant must successfully pass each course attempted in accordance with their program's requirements as outlined in the academic catalog for all courses. Any withdrawals or courses not successfully passed in accordance with the program requirements will terminate the scholarship.3. Applicant must maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.25 or better for all courses.4. Applicant may not have an unapproved attendance gap greater than 35 days.

Terms and
Conditions

- b. Recipient is Academically Disqualified, Disqualified for Admission, Scholastically Disqualified, Scholastically Suspended or Expelled as outlined in the University Catalog.
 - c. Recipient is out of attendance on an unapproved leave of absence for more than 35 days.
 - d. Recipient completes their doctoral degree program.
 - e. Receives the maximum scholarship award
 - f. Two years (730 days) from the start date of recipient's first course notwithstanding any approved leave of absence(s).
7. If recipient has applied for or is receiving Title IV financial aid funding, this scholarship may reduce the recipient's eligibility for Title IV financial aid funding to comply with Title IV regulations. In addition, the recipient must maintain continuous attendance as defined by the University of Phoenix and/or must qualify for a leave of absence to maintain his/her financial aid status. Recipient is required to abide by all state and federal financial aid policies and procedures and all University of Phoenix financial policies and procedures as set forth in the University of Phoenix Academic Catalog, including remaining in good financial standing with University of Phoenix.
